#### Geo footprint and end users

- CBUs where it is implemented: 12 CBUs of EDPi
- CBUs where it is being developed: Fr, Ger, Sp, Belg, Pol, Rom, Bra, Arg, Mex, Mor, Egy, Turk.
- Russia and the USA are not using the tool itself, but are transmitting the data
- About 4200 dairy farms assessed every, or every 2 years No Extrapolation for a global volume of 3 400 millions liters of milk → would be good to onboard the last CBUs having direct milk supply
- End users: Field technicians, auditors, FRM managers (about 120 users)

## Implementation & connection to other tools

- Format of the tool: the tool is developped on WEB version (to consult data), as well on Apps for tablets (On field audit)
- Freauency of data collection: once a year BUT should be reinforced
- Timing for data collection: anytime throughout the year
- Connexion to other tools: the MilQSaT data are store in the GALAXY DATABASE which is used to « feed » FarmBook data/info



#### Budget

- For development (CAPEX in Eur) per year: 100 350 shared between CBUs no other contributors
- For maintenance (OPEX in Eur) per year: 63 415 shared between CBUs no other contributors
